Delivering Food & Friendship



Burlington Shag Club!

Doing their part to keep shagging alive in the Carolinas

In August, the Burlington Shag Club will celebrate its fifth anniversary - another good reason for those Burlington Shaggers to party! Since its beginning, the club has had a membership each year of well over two hundred and those five years have been filled with varied events. Two years ago it became a member of the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs.

To mark its fifth anniversary, the club is planning a "class reunion" of sorts for past, present, and perspective members and guests. The club was founded by Dianne Fogleman and Bob Bullard, who was DJ at the Burlington Best Western. Its main goal has been to promote shagging and have a good time while doing it - and that's just what the club continues to accomplish.

Annual events have included golf tournaments followed by cookouts, Hawaiian Luau, 50's parties, SOS warm-up parties, an afternoon with Delbert McClinton signing autographs and socializing with the members, family skating and pizza parties, and parties for just about every holiday that rolled around. The club also participates in Crop Walks, Cancer Society benefits, Christmas Cheer, and cosponsors with the Burlington Holiday Inn, an annual Shag For Heart benefit with all proceeds going to the Heart Association.

After Burlington Best Western changed its format to Top 40, the Burlington Shag Club moved its home base to Carl's, then to Churchill's. Currently, the club does not have a home base, but it is fortunate to have a choice of two places in Burlington to shag - Old Fogies and Fat Richard's.

The Burlington Shag Club has its own logo, which is displayed on shirts, jackets, visors and beer huggers. One of the benefits of belonging to the club is that members get discounts from about 30 merchants, ranging from florists to clothing stores (and even a veterinarian), when they show their membership card.

For several years members decorated and rode on a float in Burlington, Graham, and Gibsonville Christmas parades. Their float was so popular that they were even asked ahead of time by parade officials to participate. The crowds loved the Christmas shag music and line dances performed on the float. After about a dozen parades, members decided that they would rather attend Shaggers Ltd. Holiday Shag Explosion, which falls on the same weekend as the Christmas parades. It was a tough choice voting to party all weekend instead of decorating into the wee hours of the night, rigging sound equipment in generators, begging, borrowing (but not stealing) flat beds, and sixteen wheelers. And who could forget getting up before dawn and freezing while riding the floats. At the Explosion we only ride the elevator!

The club also has its own Shaggers Hall of Fame, and its first and only inductee has been Carl "Tookie" Lee, who has, since his induction four years ago, passed away. Joan Kimbro is current President and others who are serving, or have served on the board are: Sue & Randy Sandifer, Bill Inge, Lee Harless, Bob Bullard, Donnie & Karen Boone, Candy Brooks, Kent Davis, Beth & Eddie Canada, Charlie McKee, Bill Ray, C.B. Kimbro, Cheryl Cook, Ron Fogleman, Cookie & Al Fogleman, Vickie Holt, Sheila Lassiter, Hugh Walker, Margaret Hinshaw, Lock McKinnon, Candy Jarrett, Judy Johnson, Johnnie Michaels, and Dianne Fogleman.

Without a home base at times during these five years, the Burlington Shag Club has remained socially active and involved in community affairs, while continuing to grow in membership - doing its part in the Carolinas to keep the dance we all know and love alive.

Hi! Burlington Shaggers . . .






