

- 3. Secretary was absent no membership report was given. Buddy informed members we have Mid-Winter cards available once you pay your 2002 dues.
- 4. Buddy asked all in attendance to dance at Elon's Festival Of The Oaks the next day.
- 5. Christmas Party our original agreement was with Laura Walker at the Best Western. We were to pay \$300 for the room, \$15/hour for the bartender, \$15/hour for security, whatever our DJ charged, cash bar, we bring cold foods, we collect at the doors.


Since then, the Best Western has leased the lounge. Our agreement now is: no charge for the room, no charge for the bartender, no charge for security, we pick DJ, they pay, we are not allowed to bring food, have to buy from them, still a cash bar. They will still be open to the public, they will charge and keep door income. Dotty is to speak with their sales agent again and verify: admission is \$5.00/person, lounge keeps proceeds, \$200 limit on food, and if we have to share with the public.

- 14. Next meeting is Friday, November 16, 2001.




