Unlike some DJs, Murl has always seemed to be flattered when he was asked to play. I recall asking him about what he would charge to play on one of the regular, weekly shag nights in our area. Murl responded that he had a lot of friends in our shag club, and in the surrounding areas and that he would play for "whatever" just to get the chance to see some of those folks and to play some music for them. This attitude brings to mind thoughts of the old blues singers who got together and made music strictly for the enjoyment of the moment, and generally without thought of payment of royalties.

When Murl called me the other day to tell me that he would be unable to play at the 1993 Fall Cyclone, it was somewhat of a shock. I guess I had known it was coming ever since he had asked me to DJ in his place for several hours at the O.D. Arcade last Fall. But, I never really accepted that he wouldn't be playing much longer. Murl noted that he had recently gone for about 45 minutes without being able to see covers on his albums. His doctor has told him that the stress on his brought on by DJ'ing is causing his eyesight to deteriorate more rapidly than otherwise. Accordingly, Murl is quitting and giving his eyes a well deserved rest.

On behalf of Pam and I, my fellow Association of Beach and Shag Club DJs, and all of Twister's Shag Club, I would like to wish Murl the best as he hangs up his headphones. No one can argue that he has given beach music and shag dancing a lot over the years. I, for one, am glad to have witnessed it, and glad to be able to call him "friend"! The next time you see Murl, give him a pat on the back and say "thanks". He deserves it.

When someone like Murl Augustine calls it quits, it is a monumental day in shag music history. Excuse me, *no one* is "like" Murl Augustine. But shag music history will certainly take note of at least one event in 1993. You see, Murl has officially called a halt to his DJ experience due to failing eyesight. It pains me to see something like this take place because Murl has enthusiasm and love for beach music and shag dancing rarely exhibited to this extreme. Whether Murl is playing a slow song, an "old standard", some hard blues, or some other shagable tune, he always does it with a smile. And, he always gives 100% to please the crowd for which he is playing.

Like every DJ, Murl's music is a little different. In Murl's case, it is sometimes a *lot* different. Sure, he can play the same stuff everyone else is playing. But he can also play the unplayable! Anyone who has ever witnessed the crowd at the O.D. Arcade and Lounge when they were wildly clapping, singing and dancing to a tune no *other* DJ would dare play had to know there was some talent within Murl that was rare. That talent, in my estimation, is an ability to entertain and to transmit an enthusiastic level of fun to the audience.

My wife and I first met Murl and his wife Cindy quite a few years back. We quickly became friends with them. Over the years we have shared quite a few laughs, dances and good times. They are two friends who never seem to be anything except what they genuinely are. Don't expect either to change for the sake of appearance, because they won't...and they don't need to.

A couple of years ago, I was extremely surprised when Murl commented to me that he had never played in North Carolina. At that time Murl was excited because we had just asked him to be one of our "Fall Cyclone" DJs. Not long after we reached that agreement, Murl was asked to play for several other functions and parties in this state. But, TSC can forever say they were the first to "sign him up".
