## Added Rewards

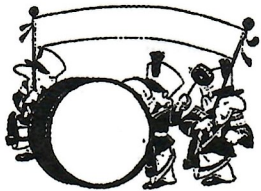

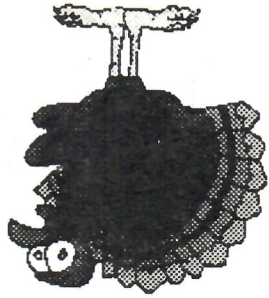
