Our Olympic Debut

It's Friday morning July 19th. The day is finally here. I didn't sleep much last night, too much to think about I guess. Every time I tried to drift off to sleep, I could hear someone say "Presenting Kevin & Susan Harrell, representing the Burlington Shag Club". Suddenly I was wide awake again. Kevin took Friday off, so he slept in a while longer; but I had to work until 12:00. Around 9:45 I got so excited thinking about what was about to take place, that I called my personnel director and begged her to let me leave now! By 10:00 a.m. I was heading home. Kevin was waiting and we packed up and hit the road. We drove down to Greenville, SC in record time I believe. We checked into the Marriott around 2:00 p.m. and walked out the front entrance and in pulled Danny & Vicky Chambers (our dance teachers). They were also on their way to the Olympics. approximately 2:30 a.m. when we turned in.

t's Saturday morning and everyone is in the lobby deciding on breakfast - we decided on Cracker Barrel. The trip to Atlanta was long. Traffic was heavy, but not as bad as we had anticipated. We found our host's house without any problems. We stayed with Ann Blake. She was working so we went on to her boyfriend Roy's house. He had 3 couples staying at his house and they were all there waiting for us to arrive. Ann & Roy catered to our every need all weekend. We couldn't have stayed with anyone nicer than they were. There was going to be a party at Brenda Rice's house Saturday night, so we went back to Ann's to dress. With camera and camcorder in hand, off to party we go. There was about 40 people there - everyone very excited about tomorrow. It was a covered dish supper supplied by ShagAtlanta club. So much food and not enough room to sample all of it! We danced on the deck, took pictures of each other, ate supper and talked about our adventures we had getting there. It was an early evening for a change. Turning in around 1:00 a.m.! We really didn't sleep much Saturday night tomorrow is the big day.

It's Sunday morning. We met at Roy's about 8:00 a.m. He cooked breakfast for us - all 10 of us and all by Eggs, bacon, sausage, cantaloupe, himself too! peaches and home-made biscuits. It was great! We had to be on the bus at 10:00 a.m. to go to the Marta Train Station. We rode Marta to downtown Atlanta. Some people we could That was an adventure. understand, some - no way! Finally, we walked through the gates of Olympic Centennial Park. representatives met at the food arena. running around trying to see as much as we could before our time to dance. Kevin should have kept me away from the Olympic Superstore. How we will make our next house payment now is still up in the air. The square dancers were almost finished, so we all knew we were next. Boy, was that nerve wracking just thinking about it. First it was the Hall of Famers. They all lived up to that title, too! They were wonderful. We saw some steps that were unreal. Then it was the cream of the crops turn. That's what he called us. Each state danced - one state at a time. There were 42 clubs total representing the ACSC, 22 of which were from North Carolina (we had the most clubs there - 22). They had to split us up into 2 groups of 11. Being out there dancing in front of all those people gave us mixed feelings. We were scared to death, but at the same time, thrilled and honored to be there. The first time ever in the history of the Olympics to dance the shag not for the gold, but for the preservation of the dance. One is just as good as the other to me. I can live without the gold, but I'm not so sure about the shagging. The song we danced to was Kansas City. It was probably the shortest dance we have ever done, but I can honestly say it will be the most memorable dance of our lives.
