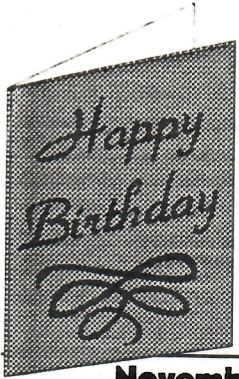

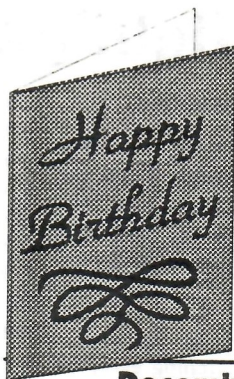
A Little Bit About Our Club

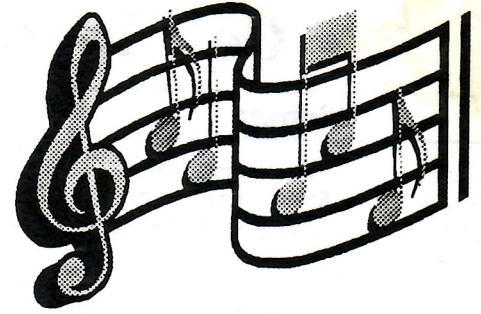

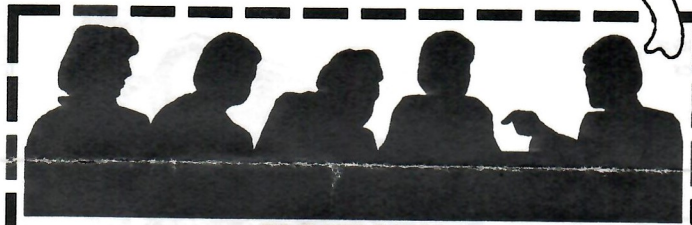

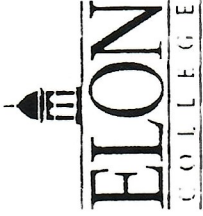

Few people know how much work is required to conduct an event of this magnitude. Everything was well planned and supervised. Thanks for a job well done.

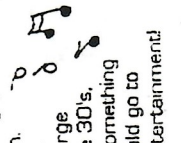

GORGEOUS & GAUDY ... JUKEBOXES

Jukeboxes were an integral part of the Great Depression. Few people had, or could afford, their own phonographs. And if they were lucky enough to own one, maintaining large collections of records was a financial impossibility. In the 30's, not even every household had a radio receiver ... now something that we take for granted. But if you had a nickel, you could go to your local hangout and partake of the best in musical entertainment!

Jukeboxes were once a designer's dream. The uninhibited screaming colors, the circles, bubbles and swirls, were all part of the design elements to take us out of this world.

Even when radio became a staple in every home, the jukebox provided what radio couldn't. The jukebox could be tailored to reflect the musical tastes of an individual establishment. Jukeboxes satisfied the special interest listeners and afforded many musicians, especially blacks, with their only avenue of national exposure. Generally, there was no opportunity for black performers to get broad public radio play. But with the jukebox, ethnic and regional music gained an audience and, more importantly, sold records! Jukeboxes enriched our musical tastes and heritage forever.

The surface cosmetics of the jukebox were somewhat restrained due to shortages during World War II. The fervor of its contents were undiminished, however. Through all the grim years, we danced to a frenzied beat - Lindy, Shag, Jitterbug, Boogie-Woogie - the sounds of the jukebox drowned out the depressing news reports of the war.

We are yet to pin down exactly how the "jukebox" got its name. Until the late 30's it was called *the automatic phonograph*. Some say that the name, *jukebox*, derives from an old southern word of African origin, *juke*, meaning to dance. Whatever the origin, the name *jukebox* endured, though the old boxes themselves are now on the endangered species list.

"I consider myself very fortunate to own a 78 rpm '48 Rockola jukebox which I purchased a few years back from good friend and reknown beach music DJ, Richard Nixon, and this is one of my most prized possessions. I love to drop in a quarter and get five plays of loud, thumping, low-fidelity rhythm and blues ... and watch the swirling, glowing lights reflect around the darkened room. It's gaudy ... yet gorgeous!"

B. Vice-President

- 1) To assume the duties of the President in their absence.
- 2) To act as coordinator between committee chairs.
- 3) To establish new ideas for the club.
- 4) To help form all committees.
- 5) To be in charge of the club Ways and Means.

C. Secretary

- 1) To take minutes of the club meetings.
- 2) To read minutes of the previous meetings or highlight in the newsletter.
- 3) To conduct all club correspondence as directed.
- 4) To maintain a file of all club correspondence, minutes, etc.
- 5) To maintain a list of club officers, committee chairs, committee members and club members.
- 6) To call meetings to order in the absence of the President and Vice-President until a pro-team can be elected. The election shall take place immediately.

D. Treasurer

- 1) To receive and bank all club monies.
- 2) To keep bookkeeping records for all funds.
- 3) To dispense all money as the club may direct.
- 4) To give monthly financial reports.
- 5) To give a complete financial statement of the previous year monies by the April meeting of the current year.
- 6) To insure all checks are approved by the President.

Section 4. Officers shall be nominated, by secret written nomination, from the general membership, at the November meeting and elected by secret ballot at the November meeting. Their term begins at the first of the next year.

Section 5. No member shall hold more than one (1) office at any one time. Officers of the Burlington Shag Club, Inc. shall not hold an office in any other shag club.

Section 6. Any officer missing three (3) unexcused business meetings shall be removed from office. The President shall upon approval of 2/3 of the members present appoint a new officer to complete the term.

ARTICLE 5

MEETINGS

Section 1. The regular meeting in December shall be known as the Annual Meeting and shall be for the purpose of installing new officers. The annual reports shall be received by the April meeting.

Section 2. The regular meeting of the club shall be held on the third Friday, at 7:30 PM, at a place agreed upon by the members once monthly, or once a month as most beneficial to the functions of the club.

Section 3. Special meetings may be called by the President, or by written request of at least eight (8) members. Three (3) days notice must be given for special meetings, except in case of emergency.

ARTICLE 6

QUORUM

A quorum shall be considered to be present when eight (8) or more members are in attendance.

ARTICLE 7

CLUB MONIES

Section 1. Definition: All monies, ie. dues, donations, committee funds and equipment.

Section 2. Disbursal are to be made by the club Treasurer for all proven debts. All checks issued must be signed by the club Treasurer or President.

ARTICLE 8

COMMITTEES

Section 1. The Committees of the Burlington Shag Club, Inc. will be as follows:

A. Entertainment Committee

- 1) To be staffed by club members on a volunteer basis.
- 2) Elect a Chairman and a Co-Chairman from the group.
- 3) To plan and implement (after approval of the members at the general meeting) all the clubs functions such as the Luau, Christmas party, Halloween party and any other event they would like to present. This requires all necessary arrangements to be made.
- 4) To see the tickets (if necessary) for the said event are available and distributed to the club members to be sold. Not all of the club members will be available for ticket sales. This includes the tracking of the ticket numbers (if required).
- 5) To use the Telephone Committee to help promote and distribute the tickets to the club members (if needed).

B. Golf Tournament Committee

- 1) To be staffed by club members on a volunteer basis.
- 2) Elect a Chairmen and a Co-Chairman from their group.
- 3) To plan and implement (after approval of the members at the general meeting) two or more Golf Tournaments each year.
- 4) To see the tickets for the tournament are available (if required) to the members and guests.
- 5) To make all the necessary arrangements with the Golf Course to be used.
- 6) To use the Telephone Committee to help promote the event.

C. Telephone Committee

- 1) To be staffed by club members on a volunteer basis.
- 2) Elect a Chairman and a Co-Chairman from their group.
- 3) All other Committees will contact the Chairman of the Telephone Committee if their services are required. The Committee requesting telephone help will be responsible for clear instructions as to what is expected of the Telephone Committee.
- 4) To divide the membership list among the Telephone Committee will be the responsibility of the Chairman.

- 5) It will be the duty of each Committee member to call the members assigned to them. If there are Long Distance calls to be made, assign them to one person. They will be reimbursed for those calls.

ARTICLE 9

AMENDMENT OF THE BYLAWS

These bylaws may be amended at any regular club meeting by a vote of the members present as stated in the Quorum in Article 6, provided the amendment has been submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting.
