




Note: There are several things I forgot to mention during the writing of this novel. Rather than trying to go back and insert them in their proper place, we're going to put them right here.


Christmas Cheer 1999 - Linda and Bob Maccia



As you all probably know, we chose two families to help for Christmas 1999 - and we picked two wonderful families. One family has 6 children, ages 12, 9, 7, and triplets, age 2. The other family is a single mother with a 6 month old and a 2 year old. Both families really needed help and we were so happy that we, the Burlington Shag Club, could give it.

Bob and I went to see the families prior to shopping and we were amazed. The family with 6 children only asked for "Santa gifts" for the children, the mom and dad did not want a thing. The father works a swing shift in order for the mother to finish her studies to become a nurse, attending ACC. They had 3 children, wanted one more, and she had triplets! At our first visit, the mom specifically said that there was no way they could do anything for the 6 children for Christmas; it was just too much for them to handle. She was so vibrant, happy, and appreciative. All the children needed clothes and shoes, and the children had made their own Christmas list for Santa. Would you believe there were only three items on each child's list and one of those happened to be either a pair of jeans or a specific t-shirt? The triplets list, which the mother had made, was almost nothing and Pampers was one of the few items. When I told the mom we were providing Christmas Dinner for the family turkey, dressing, and all the trimmings, she nearly fainted. She was thrilled, to say the least. We met all 6 children and they were precious; very sweet, very well-mannered, and beautiful. We never got to meet the dad; he was at work.

The other family, the single mom with the two babies was a little different story. The mother is 23, and has no support and no family here at all. She is going to school at ACC, but is unable to work; has no car and has basically lived on practically nothing. She had no TV, no radio, no pots and pans, only one frying pan for cooking. She only asked for clothes - clothes for her children, and I asked what she herself needed and she needed pajamas, socks, and a pair of shoes. Needless to say, we left her and her children and I was determined she was going to have a TV and she was going to have it soon. (This first visit was about 3 weeks before Christmas). We went home and got some things together; clothes of mine (that didn't fit me any longer, of course!) and I went to my sister Pam, and she had some things. I called my daughter Lori; she gave us some things and she also had a TV that she and Stephen were not using anymore. We packed up about 3 bags of clothes, diapers, warm clothes and pajamas for the 2 year old, the TV, a radio, a brand new set of pots and pans, toaster, can opener, bouncy seat for the baby, and within 24 hours we were back at the apartment with all that stuff. This girl, 23, and all alone except for her children, was speechless. She actually hugged the



box of pots and pans. She told me she had never, ever had a set of pots and pans. My daughter sent clothes for the babies and some blankets. She was so appreciative and so excited about everything, she hugged us both and she cried and I cried. We left her apartment and we felt good. There were still things to buy for her, but they would come at Christmas. About a week later, the mom called me to let me know the TV had "blown up" and the picture tube had gone, so there she was again without any TV. It took about 6 days, but we were on a mission - shopping for a TV, and we found one.

Bob and I shopped for 3 weeks and we were determined to get as much as we possibly could for these 8 children with the money alloted, and we did. Each child got an outfit and a pair of shoes; toys, games, dolls, books from Santa and the family of 6 had a big Christmas dinner with all the trimmings. The young mom didn't need the Christmas dinner prepared, so we got gift certificates for her to use as she needed them from the food store.

The Saturday before Christmas we delivered the single mom and her children's presents because she needed some things as soon as she could get them. We were able to buy some clothes for the mom and shoes and of course clothes, pajamas, Pampers, and a little food for the children - and a brand new TV.

We did go back on Christmas Eve to deliver a few little things, and the TV was on, the children were warm in their new winter clothes and Mom had new things too. Again, she hugged us good-bye, thanked us warmly and asked that we share her feelings of gratitude with all of you. What a feeling when we walked away - that's what Christmas is all about.

Christmas Eve, before noon, we delivered things to the family with the 6 kids along with a full turkey dinner. Bob and I "smuggled' the bags of toys and clothes inside the house while the children were in the other room. The triplets were in their little high chairs eating lunch and they sat there and smiled and chattered as we brought in all the food. Again, Dad was working, and Mom was speechless when she saw all the things. She was so happy that they could have a real Christmas Dinner with the whole family. She hugged me and thanked Bob and me over and over and she cried, and of course, I cried. She told us that their children would not have had anything for Christmas if it hadn't been for us, the Burlington Shag Club, who adopted them for Christmas.

I love Christmas and every year I think this is "the best one yet", but something really happened this year. Aside from shopping for our own family and getting excited about our own grandchildren, Bob and I saw this year what Christmas really is about. There are a lot of people in the world who have nothing compared to us and being able to share with them just a little bit of what they need and what their children have dreamed about was really the best Christmas gift we had.

The young mom with the two little ones really needs clothes for the children. If any of you have grandchildren who have outgrown some things (both children are girls), and would like to give them to her, please let me know. The baby wears a 12 month size and the older girl wears a size 3. The mom wears a size 10. This young mom has had it really hard and she virtually has no money during the course of a month to buy very much of anything, just the bare necessities and she truly is trying very hard to make ends meet and help herself to a better way of life.

We talked with the larger family and they had the best Christmas ever. Everything fit, all the toys were great, and the family enjoyed a Christmas Dinner and they wanted to thank everyone for making this Christmas wonderful.

Thank you from us, and thank you from all of them. This Christmas really was "the best one yet'!!!
