MEMORIES FROM THE PAST

Excerpt from the first newsletter, September 1, 1985

The Burlington Triad Shag Club officially began accepting memberships August 3, 1985. Weeks before, a few people got the idea of a shag club and decided that the first thing to do would be to get a board of directors. This board would be made up of individuals who are genuinely interested in a shag club. The sole purpose would be to promote shagging and have a good time while doing it.

A list of 12 board members was made up. When they accepted the challenge to form a shag club, the work began. First, we had to have a home base, and naturally, Best Western came to mind. We sat down with Best Western management, and management agreed to let the facility become our home base. We would continue having beach music every Saturday night, and the Burlington Triad Shag Club would sponsor special Friday night events and future dance contests.

At the first board meeting on August 3, the board decided to name the club Burlington Triad Shag Club rather than Burlington Shag Club in hopes that shaggers in surrounding cities would feel more a part of the club.

Officers were elected at the second board meeting on Saturday, August 24. We had to have a slate of officers before we could get a taxpayer's identification number, necessary to open a checking account in our club name. It was decided that the first slate of officers would come from the board of directors, the group that founded the club. Officers will be elected by membership in the future.

Board of Directors - In case you weren't at Best Western when we introduced our board of directors, let us introduce them again: Bob Bullard, Lock McKinnon, Eddie Canada, Joan Kimbro, Cookie Fogleman, Judy Johnson, Lee Harless, Johnny Michaels, Candy Brooks, Randy Sandifer, Bill Inge, and Dianne Fogleman.

Officers - Officers for the club were elected at a board meeting on Saturday, August 24, at Polly's Seafood of Alamance. These officers who will serve until December 31, 1986, will be as follows:

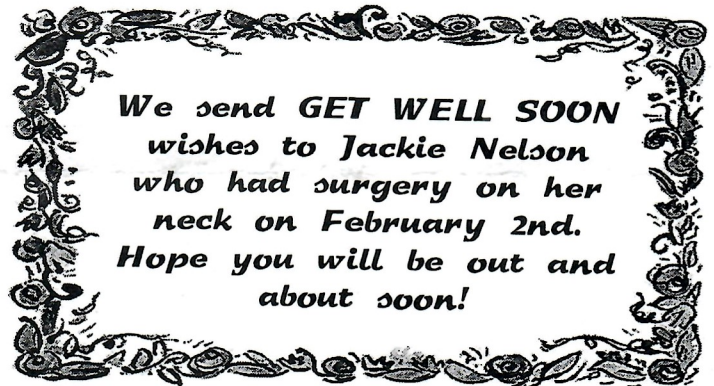
Cliff Clavin's Buffalo Theory Of Drinking Beer
