Finally, the announcement came that the Winery was ready for our tour and tasting session. One of our members opted to remain outside and was designated as our official table guard. From the white wines, to red wines, to dessert wines, everyone enjoyed the session and was well equipped to choose which wine they preferred. Many entered the gift shop, purchased their favorite wine choice as well as gift items, and prepared to join the large crowd that had gathered outside to enjoy the afternoon activities.



The receipts from the planned events of the day, Pumpkin Chunkin' and Corn Hole tournament, were donated to the Women's Resource Center Emergency fund of Alamance County. The Pumpkin' Chunkin' was definitely interesting to watch. Picture a large catapult that stood approximately 25 feet tall ready to "Chunk" a pumpkin towards the designated target.
