Birthdays: Lorna announced the July birthdays.

Treasurer's report: Amy presented the 7/18/15 YTD report. Our current balance is: \$8882.13. Discussion was held on the upcoming expenditures and income and what we will need to pay versus what we can omit if needed. Janice McSherry made a motion to accept the report. Mike Wilson seconded and all approved.


